## Grading

Tests will be given on Chapters 11 – 13, 14 – 16, 17 – 19, and 20 & 24; regardless of the dates listed above. The dates provided are only approximate, but the last test is likely to be on the second to the last class period.

You have two choices as to how your grade will be calculated.

### Method 1

Tests (3 x 100 points, the lowest of 4 will be dropped)	300 points
Final Exam	<u>150 points</u>
	450 points

Thus each test counts 22.2% of your total grade and the final exam counts 33.3%.

### Method 2

Tests (4 x 100 points, none will be dropped)	400 points
Final Exam	<u>300 points</u>
	700 points

Thus each test counts 14.3% of your total grade and the final exam counts 42.8%.

**You will be given the opportunity to choose the grading method you wish to have used on and/or before the date of the first test. This choice will be final and you won't be able to change it.**

There will be **no** make-up tests given.
